Gunthorpe, then on 6th August to the Burnt Stump


Country Park. So far, so good....

Using Acrylics

You may be new to using acrylic media, if so, here are some useful tips:

If you make a mistake, all is not lost! The best way to fix a mistake, is to simply let the acrylic paint dry - then you can paint over it.

If you need your paint layers to dry a little faster, have a hair dryer to hand. Make sure it is set to the coolest setting or hold it a little further away from the picture, thus avoiding the paint from bubbling or cracking.

One of the best tips is to clean your brushes thoroughly. Don't let any acrylic paint dry in the bristles. Left to dry and harden, it can be difficult to remove, as the nature of acrylic paint is to dry to a plastic-like finish.

Whilst you are painting it is a good idea to keep the brushes, you are using, in a beaker of water to stop them drying too much. After painting, rinse your brushes in water, pressing the tips gently against the bottom of the pot. Use kitchen paper towel to dry the brush, re-shaping the bristles, before leaving to dry-out fully. Look after your brushes and they will last!
