- Note: Friday 19th December (Portrait Class) will be our last daytime AAS meeting this year.




On Wed 21st May, our fellow member Jon Shepherd gave a demonstration of Digital Art. Jon's talk specifically dealt with creating Art on an iPad using software called 'Procreate'.

His experience has been solely with the iPad and prior to that a Wacom drawing tablet attached to an Apple Mac in previous years. Though he

noted that there are some excellent programs available for Android tablets as well.

You can get started very easily using an older iPad, the software is very affordable at only £12.99 and no ongoing subscriptions (which is rare). Ideally you need the Apple pencil, without it you would struggle, but these too can be bought secondhand.



Then we were shown how to create an example, the iPad was linked to the large screen above to make it easier to see and follow. A couple of members had brought their iPads, which made the evening more relatable and fun. This was an informative and useful talk for everybody that attended.



# Tip of the Month

#### **Creating Mood using watercolours**

You don't have to create your skies in one go! Sometimes more atmospheric effects can be made when a sky is partially painted - but then left to dry. Then further layers of subtle colours are added. To create subtle mood in your watercolour, the sky will then only require a pale wash, you can use a base wash of Raw Sienna which will add warmth and depth or simply a touch of Yellow Cadmium to create the effect of sunlight. As your sky will be blue, be careful not make the yellow too strong, as it can end up going slightly green.



Jim was born in 1934 in the small village of Biddulph, in the Staffordshire moorlands. From an early age he took great interest in drawing and painting both at, and away from school. He attended the Burslem School of Art as a part-time student in his early teens.

His subsequent work, now mostly portraits, has become well received by both fellow artists and the public, in the UK and
